

Restoration & Rehabilitation of the Roman Nymphaeum in Amman - U.S. Ambassadors Fund for Cultural Preservation (AFCP)



Work on the Roman Nymphaeum in Amman started in earnest to restore and conserve the centuries-old site and to make it a puller for the local community and the tourists in Jordan while preserving its original structure.

The Nymphaeum, under the auspices of the Department of Antiquities (DoA), is being redeveloped through a grant from the US Ambassador's Fund for Cultural Preservation. The executing authority is the Hamdi Mango Center for Scientific Research in the University of Jordan, the project leader, who will be working in conjunction with the DoA.

While documentation is important, this is a "hands-on project" where specialists in archaeology, architecture, restoration and students in the field, go down to the monument and start the stages of data collection, substance materials, analysis, and restoration for the monument.
