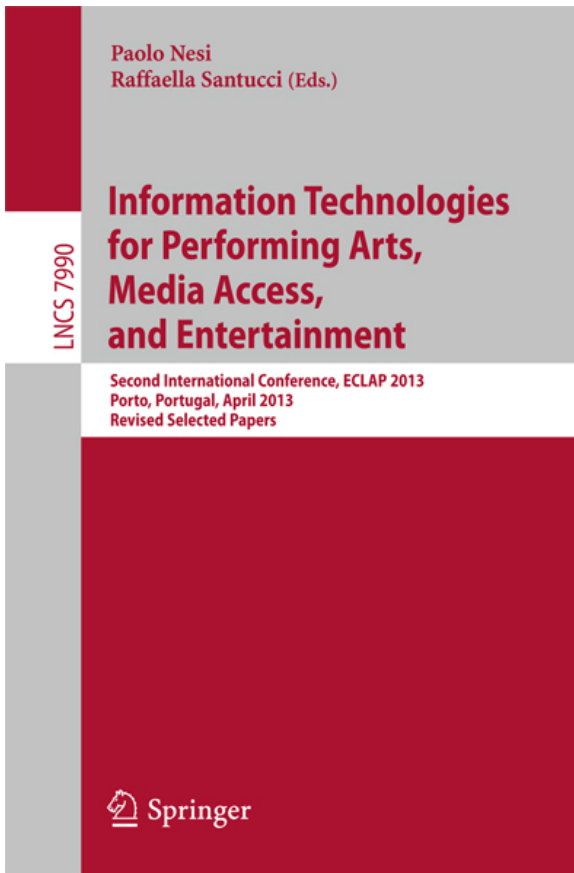


ECLAP 2013 proceedings on Springer: Information Technologies for Performing Arts, Media Access, and Entertainment

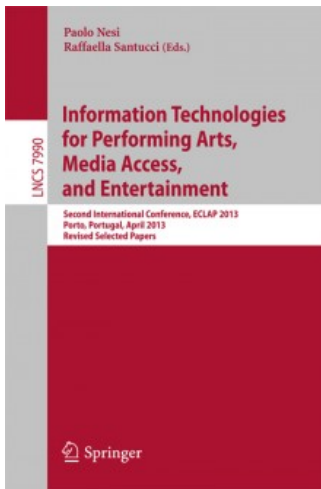
This book contains revised selected papers from ECLAP 2013.
