How museums can deliver services that are relevant, well-run and participatory will be the programme theme for **OpenCulture 2013**, The <u>Collection Trust</u>'s flagship event is be presented on 2-3 July 2013 at the Kia Oval in London. As well as the two-day conference and exhibition, it includes the SPECTRUM Local Community Gathering and a special Securitas Security Seminar. In addition, three Collections Trust Awards for excellence in Collections Management will be presented at a special evening reception on 2 July.

Two pre-event MasterClasses featuring international speakers from the Smithsonian Institution and Smarthistory at the Khan Academy will be held at the Director's Suite in the Science Museum on Monday 1 July. Attendance at each will be limited to 50 delegates.

There is currently a unique opportunity for all those in the collections community to be right at the heart of their organisation, proactively supporting positive change. All those attending OpenCulture 2013 can expect to come away excited about their ability to use collections management as a tool to promote services that are relevant, well-run and participatory, and confident in their own ability to influence positive change in their organisation.

Parallel seminar strands cover Participatory Collections Management, Collections Management in Practice, Collections Skills for the Future, and Museums as Digital Publishers.
