CIVIC EPISTEMOLOGIES, THE ROADMAP

The aim of this Roadmap is to illustrate a path towards the engagement of citizens in the research and valorisation of cultural heritage, by using distributed services like digital tools and online communication offered by the e-Infrastructures.

The 'map' draws the landscape of citizen science for the digital cultural heritage and humanities research.

The 'road' points to an action plan and a set of recommendations aggregated around each stakeholder group.

AREAS OF ACTION:

- Empowering existing e-Infrastructures with new services
- Tailoring new services to the requirements of each research community
- Improving interoperability and re-use
- Establishing the conditions for cross-sector integration
- Developing governance models for infrastructure integration
- Exploring artistic and creative practices as an instrument for engagement
- Developing ad-hoc training and awareness opportunities for targeted users
