Do you feel nostalgic? You can put yourself **in the author's shoes and visit old Detroit**, reliving his childhood. This game uses real personal photos and videos to create its strong sense of place. <u>From Home Movie</u>, by Bryan LeBeuf and James Daniello



You can embark on an immersive **road trip through the western coast of Italy** during the roaring 1970's: this road trip puts you on the Aurelia road while a multiple-choice back-and-forth dialogue reveals your lives and Italy's political tumult. Detours can be made and there are 16 possible endings. You'll find different story possibilities through dialogue options and where you choose to drive. <u>From Wheels of Aurelia</u>, by Santa Ragione
