
Take a Virtual Tour of The Uffizi Gallery in Florence

The Uffizi Gallery in Florence doesn't particularly need an introduction, seeing that it's one of the most widely-visited museums in Italy, the home of great artistic works from the Renaissance. If you pay the Uffizi a visit, you can see Botticelli's <u>The Birth of Venus</u>, Dürer's <u>Adoration of the Magi</u>, Caravaggio's <u>Bacchus</u>, Michelangelo's <u>The Holy Family</u>, and Rembrandt's <u>Self-Portrait as a Young <u>Man</u>.</u>
