




#### THE ATTACK ON DUBLIN CASTLE.

The attempt to enter Dablin Castle was one of the most exciting incidents of the uprising. About ten minutes past 12 noon on Monday a small party of Volinteers, with two young women in the rear, marched up Cork Hill towards the gates of the Upper Castle Yard. They were fully equipped, as if for a long adventure. At the moment few could have duesed their desperate enterprise. They might have if Ar0020008 o pass through Castle and so they reached the Castle en-Firees trance, which was open, and guarded only by a policeman and a sentry. When the policeman saw they were going to enter the Castiel Yard, he moved quickly in front of them, and raised his hand as a sign that they could be! come in. But the Volunteers were determined, and did not turn back. They remained where they were for a few brief second. facing the constable. Then occurred the deed that revealed the daring object of the Volunteers. One of their number, stand. ing out in front of the policeman, levelled his rife at him, and before the unhappy man could draw his revolver, fired point-blank. 

#### Timothy Morris - Farmer Minyip, Victoria, Australia



Timothy Morris migrated to Australia with seven children after the death of his wife (Mary Fox) and their new child Johanna. He did not appear to seek gold. Settled first Sunbury, Vic and then took up land at Minyip. Dry country but he was successful. Until early 2000s there were still Morris family farming there. He is buried in Minyip with family members including son Richard.


