Famous for the cult of Saints Pellegrino and Bianco, the small village of San Pellegrino in Alpe is the highest in the Apennines to be inhabited and holds a centuries-old history of crafts, small gestures, objects and figures that are part of the living collective memory.

In the rooms that for centuries housed travelers and pilgrims are now collected more than 4,000 objects and tools that have marked the daily life of the inhabitants.

An invaluable tangible and intangible heritage, which in the Ethnographic Museum "Don Luigi Pellegrini" is expertly preserved for future generations.



The museum's creator is Don Luigi Pellegini, who first had the idea of collecting the tools of daily work to preserve the memory and identity of rural life in Garfagnana.

Today, the museum is divided 14 rooms, each set up according to a unique theme and reconstructed to reproduce the ancient living and working environments.
